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Dear Parents/ carers,

As we begin a new school year, we would like to remind families about the importance of reading at home and our **Rickleton Read to Succeed** reward scheme. Reading regularly helps children to develop key reading skills and, most importantly, a love of reading that can last a lifetime. At Rickleton Primary School, we recognise the important role that parents and carers play in supporting reading.

Our **Read to Succeed** scheme encourages children to become regular readers and celebrates them as our **'Star Readers'**. All children need to do is read at home and have their Reading Record signed by an adult. We encourage children to have **at least four entries recorded each week**, and class teachers will check Reading Records regularly.

All children need to do is read at home and have their Reading Record signed by an adult. The children will receive a reading record this week. For all year groups, we expect there to be at least four entries recorded a week. Once a week the class teacher will check the record to see how many times it has been signed.

Our Read to Succeed incentives

1. For every week that your child has an entry in their reading record, they will receive Class Dojo points depending on the number of times they have read. Those children achieving gold and platinum will be entered into a raffle. The raffle will be drawn at the end of every term with exciting prizes to be won!

- Platinum- Reading 6-7 times a week = 6 dojos
- Gold – Reading 4-5 times a week = 4 dojos
- Silver – Reading 2-3 times a week = 2 dojos
- Bronze- Reading once a week = 1 dojos

2. Children are encouraged to work as a class to hit a weekly class target of 70%+ of children reading 4 or more times (gold and platinum). Those classes who achieve the 70+% target receive a certificate. When the class has earned 3 certificates, they then choose a special golden book. This is a book to add to their class library collection. The class reading achievements are celebrated during our Monday assemblies.

3. At the end of the school year, those children who have consistently read at least 4 times a week throughout the year will be added to a raffle. There will be a winner from each Key Stage. Staff will also nominate children that have shown enthusiasm and a positive attitude towards their reading. This academic year, Read to Succeed will launch on Monday 14th September. We are very excited and hope these incentives will support your child with their willingness and passion to read at home.
